| 24 | HOPE Lawncare for one (1)-year with the option of two (2) additional one (1)-year terms; and,            |
| 25 | WHEREAS, Little Rock, Ark., Resolution No. 15,982 (May 16, 2023) authorized a contract                   |
| 26 | extension with HOPE Lawncare for one (1)-year with the option of one (1) additional one (1)-year term;   |

| 29 | (1)-year term with HOPE Lawncare, in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Twenty-One Thousand,            |
