<p style="text-align: center;"><b>SYNOPSIS</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>FISCAL IMPACT</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>RECOMMENDATION</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>BACKGROUND</b></p>	<p>To approve Permanent and Temporary Easements of City-owned land east of Clinton Avenue for use as the Southeast Trail Pedestrian and Bicycle Route.</p> <p>There is no fiscal impact from this right-of-way dedication. The Southeast Trail project is funded through a Transportation Alternative Grant from Metroplan and the Arkansas Department of Transportation authorized by Resolution No. 15,126 (December 17, 2019). Matching funds are provided through a cooperative effort between Pulaski County and a City Street Fund Special Project.</p> <p>Approval of the resolution.</p> <p>This new trail project will connect to the Arkansas River Trail at the Clinton Presidential Library and continue east adjacent to 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, then continue along the Arkansas River on top of the river levee owned by Levee District 2 to Temple Street.</p>
