

1 **Section 3.** If a policy is researched and drafted, and approved by the City Attorney as to its legal form
2 and any possible impact upon the constitutional rights of any person or entity, is adopted by the Mayor and
3 Members of the Board of Directors prior to February 1, 2025, this moratorium shall end on the date of such
4 adoption.

5 **Section 4.** Nothing in this Resolution shall adversely impact the right of persons to hold hand-carried
6 signs within the public rights-of-way, or on property leading to the entrance of public buildings, during the
7 period of this moratorium so long as such action is consistent with the First Amendment to the U.S. Con-
8 stitution, and Article II of the Arkansas Constitution.

9 **Section 5. Severability.** In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or
10 word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or adju-
11 dication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution, which shall remain in full force and effect
12 as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the reso-
13 lution.

14 **Section 6. Repealer.** All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent with
15 the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
