14	WHEREAS, UPS systems are critical to systems that support 911, Fire, and Police; and		
15	WHEREAS, Existing UPS systems are reaching obsolescence at the age of over 15 years old;		
16	WHEREAS, the City wishes to purchase Vertiv's Liebert UPS system; and		
17	WHEREAS, Resolution 1,518 (August 3, 2021) intent to spend American Rescue Plan Act Funds on		
18	Critical Information Technology Upgrades to Cybersecurity and IT infrastructure across City		
19	Departments		
20	WHEREAS, the service is to be procured through the Cooperative Purchasing Program, Omnia		
21	Contract # EV2370; and		
22	WHEREAS, the cost for the contract will be in an amount not to One Hundred Fifty-One Thousand,
