

1 adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance which shall remain in full force and
2 effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part of the
3 ordinance.

4 **Section 4. Repealer.** All ordinances, resolutions, bylaws, and other matters inconsistent with this
5 ordinance including, but not limited to Little Rock, Ark., Rev. Code § 2-116 (1988), and Little Rock, Ark.,
6 Ordinance No. 22,215, § 8 (December 20, 2022), are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

7 **Section 5. Emergency.** *The ability of the City to assure appropriate payment of salaries and benefits*
8 *to the Mayor and the Members of the Board of Directors for the time spent in dealing with issues that come*
9 *before the Board of Directors during its meetings, in meeting with constituents individually or at*
10 *appropriate meetings, and to take the time for any additional research in order to address the policy*
11 *questions faced by a municipal corporation of the first class with a population in excess of 200,000 persons,*
12 *is essential to the , to the public health, safety, and welfare; an emergency is, therefore, declared to exist*
13 *and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.*
