<p style="text-align: center;"><b>SYNOPSIS</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>FISCAL IMPACT</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>RECOMMENDATION</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>BACKGROUND</b></p>	<p>The proposed resolution is to require only an Annual Meeting of the Recovery Center Advisory Board for the Oasis Renewal Center. Currently, Quarterly Meetings are required.</p> <p>None.</p> <p>Approval of the resolution.</p> <p>In 2010, an administrative decision by staff was made that the Oasis Renewal Center, located at 14913 Cooper Orbit Road, would be a continuation of a non-conforming use and would not require any zoning action or permits. Because neighborhood concern regarding the use of the Oasis Renewal Center by Recovery Centers of Arkansas was expressed, a resolution was approved by the Board that set forth certain guidelines that had to be followed. One guideline required Recovery Centers of Arkansas to create an Advisory Group from each surrounding neighborhood and meet once a quarter. The Recovery Centers of Arkansas reports that in 2015, the {President of the Spring Valley Manor Neighborhood Association was the only attendee at any of the meetings. During the past five (5) years, there has been only one (1) meeting that was attended by someone other than the President of Spring Valley Manor.</p>
