16	WHEREAS, Professional Services of this nature are crucial to ensure the City is well represente		
17	with the Arkansas General Assembly on any issues that may arise ranging from appropriations to		
18	programs and other legislative mandates;		
19	WHEREAS, Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars is set aside for the 2025 Legislative Session; and		
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY		
21	OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS:		
22	Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to extend the City's agreement with Impact		
23	Management and Mitchell, Williams, Selig, Gates & Woodyard to provide Governmental Affairs and		
24	Consulting Services.		
25	Section 2. The City of Little Rock will pay up to Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for the service		
26	to be provided from January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025.		
27	Section 3. Severability. In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or		
28	word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or		
29	adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and		
30	effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional was not originally a part of the		
31	resolution.		
32	Section 4. Repealer. All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same, that are inconsistent		

with the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
