Narratives

Disaster Damage:

On March 31, 2023, an EF-3 tornado with peak winds of 165 mph struck the City of Little Rock, carving a 25-mile path of destruction up to 800 yards wide. The storm severely impacted several neighborhoods, including Walnut Valley, Napa Valley, Cammack Village, Colony West, Reservoir Road, and Rodney Parham. Total estimated property damage within the city reached \$85.7 million. Local inspectors conducted 1,446 structural assessments, and FEMA verified 140 homes with Major-Low or greater damage, resulting in \$12.6 million in residential losses. Of these, 40 were owner-occupied and 100 were renter-occupied units. FEMA provided \$557,923 in housing assistance, leaving an unmet residential need of \$12.1 million. Public facilities also sustained significant damage. Fire Station No. 9 was destroyed, with reconstruction costs estimated at \$4.2 million. Parks were heavily affected, including 60 acres of damage at Reservoir Park (\$1.8 million) and substantial losses at Rock Creek Park (\$1.5 million). Debris blocked major transportation corridors, including Shackleford, Breckenridge, and Cantrell, requiring extensive cleanup efforts. The commercial sector experienced \$335 million in damages, with \$51.9 million in unmet needs after insurance. Business centers like Colony West and Pavilion in the Park each reported damages exceeding \$3 million. At the height of displacement, 1,269 individuals from 700 households relied on non-congregate sheltering. Many of the affected neighborhoods had high concentrations of renters and aging housing stock, compounding long-term recovery challenges.

Recovery Needs:

Little Rock continues to face significant unmet recovery needs across housing, infrastructure, and economic development. Housing remains the most urgent priority, with \$12.1 million in unmet residential losses and a persistent shortage of affordable rental units. Many damaged homes, particularly older single-family and multifamily structures, require major repairs or full replacement. Displaced residents (renters and low-income households) need long-term support to regain stable housing. Infrastructure recovery includes rebuilding Fire Station No. 9, restoring damaged parks, repairing drainage and roadway systems, and enhancing public utilities and facilities to improve resilience against future disasters. Economic recovery remains a critical need for small businesses that experienced physical damage or revenue loss. Revitalizing commercial corridors is essential to restoring jobs and community activity. Overall recovery priorities include:

- Rebuilding and replacing damaged housing
- Restoring key public facilities and infrastructure
- Supporting affected businesses and commercial centers
- Incorporating resilient design and mitigation strategies

Overall Progress Narrative:

During the reporting period (April - June 2026), the City of Little Rock continued strengthening the administrative framework necessary to successfully implement all CDBG-DR activities. Staff refined program policies, procedures, and standard operating procedures across multiple program areas and continued implementation of the Neighborly grant management system to support application intake, eligibility determinations, case management, and reporting. Internal workflows, applicant correspondence, financial management procedures, duplication of benefits methodologies, environmental review tracking, procurement documentation, and reporting tools were further developed and standardized. Additional efforts focused on strengthening contractor compliance procedures, environmental review documentation, labor standards implementation, Section 3 compliance, recordkeeping practices, and internal monitoring procedures.

The City also continued investing in staff capacity and professional development to support long-term program implementation. During the reporting period, two staff members attended the Orientation to Sustainable Environmental Assessment Course, providing the City with in-house capacity to conduct environmental reviews. In addition, four staff members attended the Incident to Recovery training, which was offered at no cost, and two Grants staff attended the Navigating Recovery Compliance training to strengthen disaster recovery administration, regulatory compliance, and grant management.

The City also expanded outreach efforts to increase public awareness of available CDBG-DR assistance. Activities included updating the City's CDBG-DR website, developing informational flyers, creating frequently asked questions, responding to applicant inquiries, and preparing educational materials for homeowners and prospective applicants. Staff also continued planning additional outreach activities in tornado-impacted neighborhoods to increase awareness of available recovery assistance.

During the next reporting period, the City anticipates continuing applicant intake and eligibility determinations for the Housing Programs while completing additional duplication of benefits reviews, environmental reviews, inspections, and award determinations. To support implementation of the Homeowner Rehabilitation Program, a dedicated CDBG-DR Inspector is expected to begin work in late July 2026, expanding the City's capacity to conduct inspections and facilitate timely project delivery. The City also expects to begin executing rehabilitation construction contracts, advance infrastructure procurement activities, continue negotiations and acquisition activities for affordable housing sites, and further develop the Economic Revitalization and Public Services Programs.

Additional priorities include expanding public outreach, implementing HUD Technical Assistance recommendations, strengthening compliance and monitoring activities, and advancing projects toward construction and expenditure in

accordance with the City's Action Plan and HUD requirements.

During the reporting period (April - June 2026), the City of Little Rock continued building the administrative capacity necessary to implement its CDBG-DR programs. Efforts focused on refining internal policies and procedures, strengthening financial management and compliance systems, enhancing environmental review and procurement processes, and improving internal monitoring and recordkeeping practices. The City also continued implementation of the Neighborly grant management system to support program administration, case management, and reporting. Staff participated in training on environmental review, disaster recovery compliance, and grant management, expanding the City's in-house expertise and reducing reliance on outside resources. In addition, the City completed procurement activities for a dedicated CDBG-DR Inspector, who is expected to begin work in late July 2026 to support program oversight and construction monitoring.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The Homeowner Rehabilitation Program (HRP) continued implementation during the reporting period as the City advanced applications through eligibility review and project development. Program staff continued accepting and reviewing applications, verifying ownership, occupancy, household income, and disaster eligibility, while conducting Duplication of Benefits (DOB) analyses using FEMA, SBA, insurance, and applicant-provided documentation. Environmental review activities also continued for eligible properties, and property inspections were coordinated to verify disaster-related damages and identify unmet recovery needs.

During the reporting period, staff developed and refined inspection procedures, rehabilitation workflows, procurement documents, contractor qualification requirements, reimbursement procedures, and applicant guidance materials. The City also updated program policies, website content, frequently asked questions, and applicant correspondence to improve customer service and ensure consistent program information.

As of June 30, 2026, the Homeowner Rehabilitation Program had received 61 applications, completed 28 eligibility reviews, 19 Duplication of Benefits (DOB) reviews, three property inspections, and four environmental

reviews. One rehabilitation project had advanced to procurement. No construction contracts had been executed, and no rehabilitation projects had been completed as of the end of the reporting period.

During the reporting period, the City continued planning activities to support implementation of its CDBG-DR programs. The City established a partnership with the University of Arkansas Clinton School of Public Service for the 2026–2027 academic year to conduct a targeted needs assessment. The practicum will evaluate unmet needs related to housing, public services, or economic revitalization within the City's HUD-designated Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) areas and provide recommendations to help inform future CDBG-DR investments and ensure recovery efforts are responsive to community priorities. During the next reporting period, the City anticipates launching the Clinton School practicum.
